#2. Public Hearing on **Rule 61G15- 18.012 – Other Board Business for Which Compensation is Allowed** (remove sunset language)

Mr. Harris went over the proposed rule amendment. Discussion followed.

Upon motion by Mr. Mulock, seconded by Ms. Myers, to approve the proposed rule amendment as presented in the meeting materials, the motion passed unanimously.

#3. Public Hearing on **Rule 61G15- 34.004 – Design of Process and Fluid Flow Systems** (remove sunset language)

Mr. Harris went over the proposed rule amendment. Discussion followed.

Upon motion by Mr. Mulock, seconded by Mr. Albergo, to approve the proposed rule amendment as presented in the meeting materials, the motion passed unanimously.

#4. Discussion on Rule 61G15-22.012(1)(c) – Changes to the requirements for CE certificates (emails for licensees and providers about the changes)

The board discussed challenges with continuing education (CE) certificate reporting and compliance, particularly regarding the use of the NCEES portal versus DBPR's system. It was revealed that approximately half of the licensees did not properly upload their CE certificates as required. The board debated whether to switch back to DBPR's system or modify their rules, with Ms. Myers suggesting simplifying requirements by removing provider numbers and requiring separate certificates for each session. The board also discussed the potential elimination of CE requirements, though Mr. Dawson noted that building code requirements would likely prevent complete elimination.

#5. Discussion on SB108/Chapter 2025-189

Mr. Harris presented a detailed report on recent changes to the Administrative Procedure Act, highlighting new requirements for rulemaking processes, including a 30-day window for rule development after legislative changes and a 6-month timeframe for proposed rule publication. The board agreed to consider amending the delegation of authority to allow for rule development during July if needed. Mr. Harris also mentioned that other agencies, such as the Department of Health and DBPR, have been asked to make similar requests of their boards to ensure compliance with the new legislation.

Mr. Harris explained that agencies must now conduct comprehensive cost impact analyses for proposed rules, including both direct and indirect costs, and publish these estimates online. The legislature has mandated that 20% of existing rules be reviewed annually by July 1, 2030, with detailed reporting requirements to the legislature. The board discussed whether to proceed with current rulemaking efforts given the new requirements, with Ms. Myers suggesting that the board wait for further clarification before moving forward. The board also discussed concerns about the legislative burden on state agencies, noting that many agencies have experienced staff reductions while being asked to implement more rigorous rulemaking processes.

The board discussed rulemaking processes and decided to vote on two rules to delete sunset language, while deferring votes on other rules until October. The board agreed to reconvene the Rules committee in September to review proposed answers to questions about the rules. Mr. Harris suggested using the current economic analysis as a learning example for future rule reviews.


Y. New Business

#1. Letter to the Building Officials – for discussion

The board discussed the issue of fraudulent use of engineering credentials, with Ms. Ramsey suggesting that staff reach out to building officials to raise awareness and propose solutions, such as email verification. Mr. Harris recommended an in-person visit preceded by a letter, noting that while submitting fraudulent documents is a criminal offense, state attorneys rarely prosecute these cases due to their focus on violent crimes. Mr. Albergo proposed creating a voluntary system that allows engineers to verify if their credentials have been used in submissions, which could help prevent fraudulent projects even if perpetrators aren't caught. The board agreed to send their thoughts to Ms. Raybon by next Friday (8/15) to draft a letter to building officials.
