

VOLUNTARY RELINQUISHMENT OF LICENSE

Respondent, Edgar S Munoz, P.E., license No. 50051, hereby voluntarily relinquishes his license to practice Engineering in the State of Florida and states as follows:

1. Respondent's purpose in executing this Voluntary Relinquishment is to avoid further administrative action with respect to these complaints. Respondent understands that acceptance by the Board of Professional Engineers (hereinafter the Board) of this Voluntary Relinquishment shall be construed as disciplinary action against Respondent's license pursuant to Section 433.033(1)(g), Florida Statutes.

2. Respondent agrees to never reapply for licensure as a Professional Engineer in the State of Florida.

3. Respondent agrees to voluntarily cease practicing Engineering immediately upon executing this Voluntary Relinquishment. Respondent further agrees to refrain from the practice of Engineering until such time as this Voluntary Relinquishment is presented to the Board and the Board issues a written final order in this matter.


4. Upon the Board's acceptance of this Voluntary Relinquishment, Respondent agrees to waive all rights to seek judicial review of, or to otherwise challenge or contest the

validity of, this Voluntary Relinquishment and of the Final Order of the Board incorporating this Voluntary Relinquishment. Furthermore, the Board's acceptance of this Voluntary Relinquishment fully resolves all charges in this matter with no further action required by or penalties imposed on Respondent.

5. Petitioner and Respondent hereby agree that upon the Board's acceptance of this Voluntary Relinquishment, each party shall bear its own attorney's fees and costs related to the prosecution or defense of this matter.

6. Respondent authorizes the Board to review and examine all investigative file materials concerning Respondent in connection with the Board's consideration of this Voluntary Relinquishment. Respondent agrees that consideration of this Voluntary Relinquishment and other related materials by the Board shall not prejudice or preclude the Board, or any of its members, from further participation, consideration, or resolution of these proceedings if the terms of this Voluntary Relinquishment are not accepted by the Board.

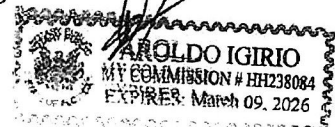

ADMINISTRATIVE COMPLAINT

COMES NOW the Florida Engineers Management Corporation (FEMC) on behalf of Petitioner, Florida Board of Professional Engineers, hereinafter referred to as "Petitioner," and files this Administrative Complaint against EDGAR S. MUNOZ, P.E., hereinafter referred to as "Respondent." This Administrative Complaint is issued pursuant to Sections 120.60 and 471.038, Florida Statutes. Any proceeding concerning this complaint shall be conducted pursuant to Section 120.57, Florida Statutes. In support of this complaint, Petitioner alleges the following:

1. Petitioner, Florida Board of Professional Engineers, is charged with regulating the practice of engineering pursuant to Chapter 455, Florida Statutes. This complaint is filed by the Florida Engineers Management Corporation (FEMC) on behalf of Petitioner. FEMC is charged with providing administrative, investigative, and prosecutorial services to the Florida Board of Professional Engineers pursuant to Section 471.038, Florida Statutes (1997).

2. Respondent is, and has been at all times material hereto, a licensed professional engineer in the State of Florida, having been issued license number PE 50051. Respondent's last known address is 1490 Sheridan Street, Apt. 3A, Hollywood, Florida 33020.

3. Offering engineering services to a client and then providing sealed and signed engineering design plans to the client constitutes the practice of engineering as defined in Section 471.005(7), Florida Statutes. Respondent prepared and signed, sealed, and dated sets of STRUCTURAL ENGINEERING documents for the following projects:

(a) “Convert Garage Door in Playroom” structural sheets signed and sealed by Respondent on 7/20/24 with embossed seal.

(b) 1629 NE 1st Ave Structural Handrail Inspection Letter, signed and sealed with a digital signature by Respondent on 7/29/24.

(c) 900 NW 51 ST, Miami, FL, structural design signed and sealed 4/29/24 by Respondent with an embossed seal.

(d) 3440 SW 13TER, Miami, FL. Structural inspection letter digitally signed by Respondent on 5/27/23.

(e) 3630 SW 14 ST, Miami. Structural documents digitally signed and sealed by Respondent on 6/28/23.

4. By Final Order (Final Order) of the Board in FEMC Case 2019028012 dated June 22, 2020, Respondent’s license was RESTRICTED from creating, producing, or certifying any Structural Engineering documents until such time as Respondent takes and passes the NCEES 16-hour Structural examination. The Final Order was not appealed and no request for stay or supersedeas was ever filed.

5. Respondent has never taken and passed the NCEES 16-hour Structural examination. As a result, when Respondent signed, sealed, and dated the STRUCTURAL ENGINEERING documents for the projects listed in Paragraph Three (3) above, Respondent was prohibited from performing such engineering work under the terms of the Final Order.

6. Section 471.033(1)(k), Florida Statutes, provides: “(1) The following acts constitute grounds for which the disciplinary actions in subsection (3) may be taken: ... (k) Violating any order of the board or department previously entered in a disciplinary hearing.”


7. By providing STRUCTURAL ENGINEERING services through sealing and signing the above referenced engineering documents after Respondent's license was RESTRICTED from providing such STRUCTURAL ENGINEERING services, Respondent violated the terms of the Final Order in FEMC Case 2019028012.

8. Based upon the foregoing, Respondent violated Section 471.033(1)(k), Florida Statutes, by violating the order of the Board previously entered in a disciplinary hearing.

WHEREFORE, the Petitioner respectfully requests the Board of Professional Engineers to enter an order imposing one or more of the following penalties: permanent revocation or suspension of the Respondent's license, restriction of the Respondent's practice, imposition of an administrative fine, issuance of a reprimand, placement of the Respondent on probation, the assessment of costs related to the investigation and prosecution of this case, other than costs associated with an attorney's time, as provided for in Section 455.227(3), Florida Statutes, and/or any other relief that the Board deems appropriate.
